BOOKING & CANCELLATION DEADLINES

KOB-D / Glimpes of Kobe

Difficulty



Price: Na - Duration: 3.00 hr(s)

On this tour of Kobe's highlights, visit one of city's best sake breweries. Kobe's excellent sake is attributed to its cold weather and high quality rice. Afterwards, visit Sorakuen to see a magnificent Japanese garden.

Sake Brewery Visit & Tasting

Depart Kobe port for a 30-minute transfer to one of Kobe's best sake breweries. Sake means "alcohol" in Japanese but also refers to a local specialty made from fermented rice. Rice sake is called "Nihonshu," meaning Japanese sake. The popularity of sake extends far beyond Japan and you can find it at many restaurants and bars around the world. Many sake breweries operate in the Nada district and offer a sampling of their brand. After your sake tasting, visit their exhibition hall and have the option to purchase your favorite bottle.

Japanese-style Sorakuen Garden

Next, a 25-minute transfer will take you to Sorakuen Garden, which has a traditional Japanese landscape and has been designated as a "place of serene beauty." Completed in the early 20th century, the gardens used to be part of the Kodera Kenkichi residence, the former mayor of Kobe. It has been open to the public since 1941.

At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach for a 15-minute transfer back to the ship.

Please note: Excursions are easily paced without the need for excessive walking or physical activities. Being able to board motor coaches and negotiate steps can be encountered. Guests may have to negotiate some steps at the sake brewery at their discretion, although they can still enjoy tasting sake and shopping without using the steps. This tour is wheelchair accessible, although some areas may not be reached by wheelchair at the sites. Lightweight, comfortable clothing and flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. The tour sequence may vary. Japanese yen is required for any purchases: guests are advised to exchange money at the airport prior the cruise. Guest must be at least 20 years old to be served alcoholic beverages. Local Tour Guides tend to have a strong accent therefore we urge flexibility.

KOB-F / Osaka Highlights

Difficulty



Price: Na - Duration: 4.75 hr(s)

Explore Japan's third largest city, Osaka, on this intriguing half-day tour. One of the gateways to ancient Japan for traders from China, Korea and the Asian continent, Osaka played a vital role in the introduction of new technologies in ceramics, forging, construction and engineering. Today, this modern Port City combines historical and cultural attractions with all the delights of a Japanese urban marvel.

Osaka Castle,

Following a 60-minute drive, see the impressive landmark, Osaka Castle. One of Japan's most famous castles, it played a major role in the unification of Japan during the 16th century. Built on a plot of land almost one square mile, the castle compound contains thirteen structures, designated as Important Cultural Assets by the Japanese government. The central castle building is five stories on the outside and eight stories on the inside, built atop a massive stone foundation that protected its occupants from sword-bearing attackers. Of particular interest are the tower's ornamental ride-end roof tiles, and bas-reliefs carved in the

shape of crouching tigers, all gilded with gold. An engaging museum occupies the interior of the building, tracing the history of the castle from the late 1500s to the present day, and housing Osaka's most significant historical and cultural artifacts.

Shitennoji Temple

After a guided tour of the castle, proceed to the Sitennoji Temple which was constructed over 1400 years ago to commemorate the victory of the war and to provide relief and settlement for the king. Today, the Shitennoji temple remains as one of the oldest architectural styles that are preserved today in Japan.

At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach for a 50-minute drive back to the ship.

Please note: Full participation may include a limited number of steps, uneven surfaces and periods of standing. This tour is wheelchair accessible, although some areas may not be reached by wheelchair at the sites. Lightweight, comfortable clothing and flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. The tour sequence may vary. Japanese yen is required for any purchases: guests are advised to exchange money at the airport prior the cruise. Photography and video are not permitted on the 3rd and 4th floors of Osaka Castle. Local Tour Guides tend to have a strong accent therefore we urge flexibility.

KOB-I / Himeji Castle & Garden

You will visit two major sites in Himeji, which is the second largest city of Hyogo Prefecture after Kobe. First one is Himeji Castle which is widely considered to be Japan's most beautiful feudal castle. Next destination is Kokoen Garden adjacent to Himeji Castle.

Himeji Castle

Following a 1.5-hour drive, arrive at Himeji Castle. Its white appearance has a nickname of Shirasagi-jo, or white heron, and was designated a World Heritage Site in 1993. Featuring huge, central pillars to support the castle, it's a mystery how they were able to build it in ancient times. From the top of the castle, you will be able to enjoy the panoramic view as reward for climbing up all the steps.

Kokoen Garden

Next destination is Kokoen Garden adjacent to Himeji Castle. The garden is on the former site of the feudal lord's residence and consists of 9 separate gardens. There are many kinds of flowers that bloom throughout the year.

After your visit, enjoy a scenic 1.5-hour drive back to the port.

Please note: Full participation requires being in good physical condition and may involve inclines, steps, uneven surfaces and extended periods of standing. There are more than 200 steps at Himeji Castle with inclines. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or guests who utilize a wheel chair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing and flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. The tour sequence may vary. Japanese yen is required for any purchases: guests are advised to exchange money at the airport prior the cruise. Local Tour Guides tend to have a strong accent therefore we urge flexibility.

KOB-K / Kyoto on Your Own Exploration

Enjoy an unguided, full day in Kyoto to explore at your own leisure. Kyoto served as Japan's capital and the emperor's residence from 794 AD until 1868. Steeped in history, Kyoto is home to approximately a quarter of Japan's National Treasures boasting countless temples, shrines and other historically priceless structures.

Free Time in Kyoto

Depart from the pier and transfer 2 hours inland toward Kyoto, an immensely historic city renowned for spectacular architecture, which includes thousands of Buddhist Temples and Shinto Shrines. Your tour escort will offer suggestions of places to visit, restaurants and will also provide a map for each guest. You will then be dropped off in the center of Kyoto and have free time all day to explore this iconic city.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate to extensive amount of walking and steps. This tour doesn't include any guided walks or visits. Activity level is at your discretion, although cobblestones and uneven surfaces are common. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or for those who utilize a wheel-chair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing and flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. Japanese yen is required for any purchases: guests are advised to exchange money at the airport prior the cruise. Local Tour Guides tend to have a strong accent therefore we urge flexibility.

KOB-E / Kobe Beef Lunch & Sake Brewery

Visit the Nada District, Japan's top sake producing region to visit one of the most well-known sake brewery museums, where guests can get a feel for Japan's culture through the art of sake production. Sake tasting and a tour of the production facility are included. Afterwards, have lunch at a local restaurant and taste the world-famous Kobe beef.

Sake Brewery Visit & Tasting

Depart Kobe port for a 30-minute transfer to one of Kobe's best sake breweries. Sake means "alcohol" in Japanese but also refers to a local specialty made from fermented rice. Rice sake is called "Nihonshu," meaning Japanese sake. The popularity of sake extends far beyond Japan and you can find it at many restaurants and bars around the world. Many sake breweries operate in the Nada district and offer a sampling of their brand. After your sake tasting, visit their exhibition hall and have the option to purchase your favorite bottle.

World-famous Kobe Beef Lunch

Next, a 30-minute transfer will take you to an authentic, local restaurant to have a taste of the world-famous Kobe beef. This meat is renowned for its mouth-watering flavor, tenderness and high amount of intramuscular fat, giving it a marbled appearance. Kobe cows are given beer to induce appetite and are massaged daily to increase their physical and mental wellness.

At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach for a 15-minute transfer back to the port.

KOB-G / Highlights of Kyoto & Bullet Train Experience

Difficulty



Price: Na - Duration: 8.75 hr(s)

Explore three of Kyoto's marquee attractions: the impressive Golden Pavilion, Nijo Castle and a traditional tea ceremony. Kyoto served as Japan's capital and the emperor's residence from 794 AD until 1868. Steeped in history, Kyoto is home to approximately a quarter of Japan's National Treasures boasting countless temples, shrines and other historically priceless structures.

Nijo Castle

Depart from the pier to Shinkobe Station where board the Shinkansen Bullet Train (approximately 30 minutes ride) toward Kyoto, an immensely historical city renowned for spectacular architecture, which includes thousands of Buddhist Temples and Shinto Shrines. Board your motor coach for a 20 minutes ride to Nijo Castle, a fortification of Cypress wood built in 1603 as the residence of the Tokugawa Clan.

An esteemed UNESCO World Heritage Site, the castle is protected by a moat, stone walls and ingenious nightingale floors, which chirp like a bird when walked upon to alert the guards of potential intruders.

Tea Ceremony, Local Restaurant

After having lunch at a local restaurant, you will have the chance to attend a traditional Japanese tea ceremony, which is an extension of Zen Buddhism. The tea master will show you how to serve properly so you will enjoy the intense flavor of Matcha along with Japanese traditional sweets.

Kinkakuji Temple

Your last stop will be made at Kyoto's most famous landmark, Kinkakuji Temple - (The Golden Pavilion). Built by Shogun Ashikaga Yoshimitsu as a villa in 1397, the three-story home was converted to a temple by Yoshimitsu's son. The Golden Pavilion follows the Shinden style of the Heian Period by being positioned at the edge of a tranquil pond. The three-story Chinese-influenced Golden Pavilion has delicately curving roofs, with the walls and eaves of the second and third stories covered in shimmering gold leaf. View the exterior of the pavilion and walk through the peaceful gardens, marveling at the mirror reflection of the temple on the still pond.

At the conclusion of your tour, board your coach for an approxiamtely 100-minute drive back to the port.

Please note: This tour requires an extensive amount of activity, about 1.5 km walking total. This tour is wheelchair accessible, but guests will need to transfer from their chair to another wheel chair provided by the venue at several locations. Lightweight, comfortable clothing and flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. Japanese yen is required for any purchases: guests are advised to exchange money at the airport prior the cruise. Guests must be at least 20 years old to be served alcoholic beverages. It's required to take off shoes at Nijo castle, the tea ceremony venue and possibly the restaurant as well. Tour sequence may vary. Local Tour Guides tend to have a strong accent therefore we urge flexibility.

KOB-J / The Kobe Beef Dinner Experience

The Kobe Beef is renowned for its mouth-watering flavor, tenderness, and high amount of intramuscular fat, giving the meat a marbled appearance. Visit a local restaurant for dinner to indulge in this prestigious delicacy.

Kobe Beef Dinner, Teppanyaki Restaurant

From the pier, board your coach for a 15-minute transfer directly to the restaurant. This evening will be all about the internationally acclaimed Kobe Beef. It is often cited that the cows are given beer to induce appetite, massaged daily and given the utmost treatment in its raising.

Afterward, return to your coach for a 15-minute transfer back to the ship.

Please note: This tour is easily paced without the need for excessive walking or physical activities. Being able to board motor coaches and negotiate steps can be encountered. This tour is not suitable for guests who utilize a wheel chair. Guests must be at least 20 years old to be served alcoholic beverages. This family friendly tour is suitable for adolescents aged 12 or older. The dress code is smart casual. Local Tour Guides tend to have a strong accent therefore we urge flexibility.

KOB-L / Nara & Osaka

Discover the spiritual side of Nara during visits to three UNESCO World Heritage Site temples. You will visit Todai-ji temple, originally built in 728 AD and renowned for the bronze Buddha statue and Kasuga-Taisha shrine. After lunch at traditional Nara hotel, you will be transferred to Osaka Castle, one of Japan's most famous sites.

Todaiji Temple, Kasuga Taisha Shrine

Depart the port for a 1.5 hour transfer to Nara. As you stroll through the temple, you will likely see many deer. They are considered messengers of the gods in the Shinto religion and are allowed to roam freely here. At the celebrated Kasuga-Taisha shrine, admire more than 3,000 stone and bronze lanterns that have been donated by worshippers and now line the pathways and hang from the buildings.

Lunch at Nara Hotel

Your lunch will be served at a traditional Nara hotel which was built in 1909. While you are enjoying the lunch, witness how beautifully the hotel is preserved.

Osaka Castle

One of Japan's most famous castles, it played a major role in the Unification of Japan during the 16th century. Built on a plot of land almost one-mile square, the castle compound contains thirteen structures, designated as Important Cultural Assets by the Japanese government. The central castle building is five stories on the outside and eight stories on the inside, built atop a massive stone foundation that protected its occupants from sword-bearing attackers. Of particular interest are the tower's ornamental ride-end roof tiles, and bas-reliefs carved in the shape of crouching tigers, all gilded with gold. An engaging museum occupies the interior of the building, tracing the history of the castle from the late 1500s to the present day, housing Osaka's most significant historical and cultural artifacts.

At the conclusion of your tour, board your coach for a 50-minute drive back to the port.

Become acquainted with some of the basic sights and sounds familiar to the city of Busan on this half-day orientation. Depart the pier by coach for the 30-minute drive into Busan. The city highlights seen or visited include the following:

The Busan Museum

The Busan Museum, offers seven regular exhibition rooms spread over three floors in addition to the Kiln Exhibition Hall, and the Outdoor Exhibition Hall. Opened in 1978, the museum has taken on a leading role in preserving traditional culture in Busan by obtaining a wealth of relics from strong excavation efforts, generous donations and purchases, and by meticulous research.

The museum was remodeled in 2002 along with the opening of Exhibition Hall 2. The wide array of relics ranges from the Prehistoric Age to the modern period. The Outdoor Exhibition Hall is home to precious pagodas, Buddhist statues, and monuments. There are over 6,000 items from excavations in Busan and the Gyeongnam area in addition to items that have been purchased, donated, and collected. Those relics reveal the important historical and cultural heritage of Busan.

Jagalchi Fish Market

Experience the local atmosphere at the harbour-side fish market, which stretches into downtown. As a seaport, the Busan fish market offers a variety of fresh seafood, including a large shellfish section in the middle of the market. Boats unload their catches very early each morning, and sell them on the spot. By the time you arrive, mountains of fresh seafood will be attractively arranged on ice. The sea air and fresh fish mingle with the resonant voices of the market folk to create an unforgettable experience.

Gukje Market (International Market)

Busan's largest and most central market area, Gukje Market was formed by merchants descended from refugees of the Korean War. The alleyways are divided into six market districts dealing in a wide variety of goods such as silk, linen, clothing, bags, glasses, and curtains. After exploring with your guide, some free time is afforded, allowing you to browse.

Following this overview, re-board your coach for the 20-minute drive back to the pier

Busan City and Haedong Yonggungsa Temple

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately one-hour drive through Busan City en route to the magnificent Haedong Yonggungsa Temple, one of the visited and revered Buddhist temples in Busan. Founded in 1376 and restored in 1970, this Buddhist Temple is located atop a huge rock emerging from the ocean. This spectacular site houses a number of temples along the shoreline, along with dozens of statues and sculptures. The sound of the East Sea ocean waves and melody of sutra chanting from the temple create a magical effect, and further enhance the appeal of this stunning architectural marvel.

Oryukdo Skywalk

Next, re-board your coach and drive along Haeundae Beach to the Oryukdo Skywalk. Opened in 2013, the skywalk is located in the Seungdumal area, which is regarded as the dividing point between the East Sea and the South Sea. This incredible iron-and-glass structure is perched above a 115-foot (35-metre) high coastal cliff, and its transparent floor and walls offer stunning panoramic vistas of the coast, sea and distant Daemado Island on clear days. Following your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 50-minute drive back to the pier.

Gamcheon Culture Village

Located in the Korean coastal city of Busan, isnestled into the side of a mountain, the former sluma mishmash of pastel-colored, Lego-like houses, painted in 2009 to lure visitors up steep slopes and through its tiny alleys. Gamcheon Village, once a dilapidated neighborhood that housed refugees following the Korean War, it was transformed in 2009, when the government's Ministry of Culture, Sports, and Tourism launched an initiative to turn the area into a creative community. Under the theme, "Dreaming of Busan Machu Picchu," painters and sculptors added their artistic touch to the streets, homes and businesses of Gamcheon. Nowadays, tourists flock here to look at some of the street art in the country.

Yongdusan Park

Yongdusan Mountain (49m) in downtown Busan is one of Busan's three famous mountains. The mountain held shrines for the mountain gods built by the Japanese before the 8.15 Liberation. Now the mountain is home to a variety of monuments, including Cheokhwabi Monument, Chunghontap Pagoda, 4.19 Revolution Monument, a statue of Admiral Yi Sun-shin, and the Busan Tower. During the Korean War, refugees built houses on the side of the mountain all the way to the summit but these neighborhoods were burned down twice, leaving the mountain bare. Since then, fierce efforts of planting trees have led to transforming the burnt mountain to a beautiful park. The park was called Unam Park at the time of the Liberal Party's ruling but was renamed to Yongdusan Park after the April 19 Revolution in 1960. The park offers views of Busan Port and the surrounding scenery. Busan Tower is a symbol of Busan that stands proudly at 69 meters above sea level at a height of 120 meters. The top of the tower is modelled after the Baldaquin of Dabotap Pagoda in Bulguksa Temple, Gyeongju.

Gukje International Market:

Following the Korean War, refugees who fled to Busan set up stalls in order to make a living, and this was the beginning of the Gukje Market (gukje meaning "international" in Korean). The Gukje Market is one of Korea's largest markets; each alleyway is crowded with stalls, and it connects to Bupyeong Market, Kkangtong Market, and other smaller markets. The market stocks such a wide variety of goods, that you can find almost everything you need right here.

Please note: This tour has an extensive amount of walking of approximately 4 miles or 2.5 km with more than 200 steps and steep hills at Gamcheon Cultural Village and a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach. It is not suitable for guests with limited mobility or those who utilize a wheelchair. We suggest wearing comfortable clothing and walking shoes as well as sun protection.

Cooking Institute

A raw or fried egg and sliced meat (usually beef) are common additions.

Following your cooking lesson, dine on the meal you helped to prepare. After the cooking class, board your coach and drive to the pier for approximately 10-minute.

Gyeongju

Leaving the pier, drive through the city and countryside for approximately 90 minutes towards Gyeongju. Located on the eastern coast where the morning sunlight first touches the Orient, Gyeongju was once the capital of the Shilla Kingdom and centre of Korea when Shilla unified the peninsula in 676 A.D. It was designated by UNESCO as one of the world's ten most historically significant sites and is known as the 'museum without walls'.

Tumuli Park

Arrive at Tumuli Park, a collection of royal Shilla tombs located in the middle of Gyeongju. The park contains 20 tombs, of which Chonmachong (Flying Horse Tomb) is the most famous. Its name comes from the picture of a flying horse found painted on white birch bark when the tomb was excavated in 1974, and the tomb yielded more than 10,000.

Gyeongju National Museum

Gyeongju National Museum, a place of compelling interest, preserves much of the Shilla heritage including magnificent gold crowns, pottery, Buddhist artefacts, and stone sculptures. The museum also houses the Divine Bell of King Seongdeok the Great, also referred to as the legendary Emuille Bell, one of Asia's largest and most resonant bells, 19 tons of bronze standing 11 feet (3.4 metres) high. Afterwards, the coach takes you to a local restaurant for a Traditional Korean Bulgogi (Marinated Beef) set menu lunch. Relaxed and refreshed, continue with a visit to Bulguksa Temple.

Bulguksa Temple

One of Korea's best well-known temples on the western slope of Mt. Tohamsan, Bulguksa Temple is a monument to both the skill of the Shilla architects and the depth of Buddhist faith at the time. While most of the wooden buildings have been rebuilt over the centuries, all the stone bridges, stairways and pagodas are original. In 1995, Bulguksa Temple was added to UNESCO's World Heritage List.

Re-board your coach one last time for the 90-minute journey back to Busan and the awaiting ship.

It was also known as "Dottegi (bustling plea) Market." All foreign products found in the country at that time were supplied from this market. A night market opens from 19:30-24:00. There are 11 kiosks selling Korean food, 6 kiosks selling international foods such as Japanese and Filipino foods, and 13 vendors selling clothes and accessories.

Omicho Market

The market has been supporting the people as the "Kitchen of Kanazawa" by providing not only food but also daily necessities for about 270 years, especially, seafood that is in season will be found amazingly cheap and fresh.

Wagashi Making Class

At the end of the market visit your tour will continue with a short drive to Wagashi Making Class. Wagashi, Japanese sweets, are another traditional product that Kanazawa is famous for. In this tour, you will get a lesson in making handmade Japanese sweets by the sweet-making master. Aside from making three sweets during the lesson, you bring home as a gift one sweet made by the instructor who is a professional sweet maker from one of Kanazawa's most famous stores. You will sigh when you open the box with your sweets, as they look amazingly beautiful!

Kenroku-en Garden

Next, a quick transfer will take you to the final stop on this informative excursion; Kenroku-en, one of the three celebrated "Great Gardens of Japan." This 25-acre landscape garden was originally developed by the great daimyo of Kanazawa Castle. Kenroku-en boasts Japan's first fountain, a teahouse dating to 1774, and a pagoda donated to the Maeda clan by the great warlord Toyotomi Hideyoshi. The celebrated Ganko-bashi is a bridge comprising 11 red stones laid out to resemble a formation of flying geese.

After your walk through the garden re-board your coach and a short drive will take you back to the pier.

Experience the rich architectural traditions of the Japanese countryside on a tour including two of the region's most picturesque villages.

Shirakawago Village, Japanese mountain style lunch

Shirakawago widely-known as one of the most scenic places in Japan, is surrounded by dramatic pine tree-covered mountains. After an approximately 90 minutes journey, arrive to Shirakawago Village. Here you'll find the unique Japanese thatched-roof farmhouses that are the center of attention. There are approximately 90 thatched farmhouses, sheds, and barns built about 200-300 years ago that were added to UNESCO'S World Heritage List in 1995. They are examples of the Gassho-zukuri style, a form of construction that resembles hands-clasped in prayer.

Aesthetically pleasing, the steeply pitched roofs are extremely practical during the heavy snowstorms of the Shokawa River valley. Pitched at 60 degrees and oriented along a north-south axis, the farmhouses are able to more efficiently capture sunlight and shed weighty burdens. Today, you will enter one of the farmhouse, Wada Family's House. Wada family take important role in Shirakawa-mura and was elected the first village mayor in Meiji Period. Located in the northern part of the Ogimachi, three stray farm houses including living room, guest room, family's room and store house. After your guided tour

you'll be given some free time in the village, then at an appointed time re-board the coach and your tour continues to Gokayama. Prior arrival you'll be taken to a local restaurant for a Japanese mountain style set-menu lunch. After lunch an approximately half hour drive will take you to Gokayama Washinosato.

Gokayama Village, local activities

Like Shirakawago, Gokayama earned its place as a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage Site in 1995 and boasts the same style of Gassho-zukuri pitched-roof construction. Arriving in this charming village, you'll proceed to a special site where you'll be treated to fascinating demonstrations of the art of Japanese paper making. Known as washi, the process of creation is long and involved and that often undertaken in the depth of winter. The cold weather inhibits bacteria, prevents decomposition, makes the fibers contract for a crisp feel, and provides farmers with a source of winter income.

The kozo tree, or paper mulberry, is the most commonly used fiber in making Japanese paper. The kozo branches are boiled and stripped of their outer bark, and then dried. The fibers are then boiled with lye to remove the starch, fat and tannin and any remaining impurities in the fibers are picked out by hand. The kozo is laid on a rock or board and beaten. Wet balls of pulp are mixed in a vat with water and one of two traditional methods of paper making (nagashi-zuki or tame-zuki) is employed. In both methods, pulp is scooped onto a screen and shaken to spread the fibers evenly. Nagashi-zuki (which uses neri in the vat) produces a thinner paper, while tame-zuki (which does not use neri) produces a thicker paper.

You'll have the unique opportunity to lend a hand in the process of Japanese paper-making, enjoying the camaraderie of this shared activity. At the end of this unique experience re-board your coach and commence the approximately 90 minute journey to the pier via the breathtaking Japanese countryside.

HKD-A / Introduction to Hakodate

Discover the local lifestyle, culture and history of Hakodate during this scenic, half-day orientation tour of the city.

Hakodate Morning Market

Depart the pier for the brief walk to the Hakodate Morning Market. Upon arrival, take a guided stroll through this bustling market, which is engulfed by cars and people from the time the 400 stalls open at 5 a.m. Discover an abundance of fresh fish and seafood, including squid, salmon eggs, sea urchins and the hairy crabs for which Hokkaido is famous. The market also offers fresh, locally-grown vegetables, along with flowers and household goods.

Goryokaku Park and Tower

Next, board your coach and drive to Goryokaku Park. The park is home to the remaining walls of Japan's first Western-style fort. The fort is named Goryokaku, or 'Pentagon Fort' due to its star shape. Nothing is left of the citadel, which was constructed by the Togukawa Shogunate to defend Japan against the threats from the north. During your visit, you can ride the elevator up to the Observation Deck of the 351-foot-tall (107-metre-tall) tower at the park entrance, and take in splendid views of the park, fort, Mt. Hakodate and the downtown area.

Mount Hakodate

Leaving Hakodate Morning Market, your drive proceeds up to the Mount Hakodate Overlook, or 'Hakodateyama'. Upon arrival, take one way only the Hakodate Ropeway (cable car) up to the all-weather observatory at the 1,100-foot (335-metre) summit, which offers panoramic views over the surrounding area (weather permitting).

Following your visit, re-board your coach for the approximate 40-minute drive back to the pier.

(Hakodate cable car will not be operated due to the bad weather. In this case, the tour will go up/ down to Mt. Hakodate by bus and may partially vary the tour itinerary)

Hakodate City Museum of Northern Peoples

Depart the pier for the morning drive into Hakodate and the Hakodate City Museum of Northern Peoples, which is located in an old bank building on the Motoi-zaka slope leading away from the consulate. During your visit, you view exhibits of valuable tools and ethnological materials that were collected over many years by Professors Osamu Baba and Sakuzaemon Kodama, and used by the Ainu people in their daily life. Learn about the people across Eastern Siberia and the Alaskan Islands.

Mount Hakodate

Next, your drive proceeds up to the Mount Hakodate Overlook, or 'Hakodateyama'. Reaching the summit with the Hakodate Ropeway(cable car), arrive at the observatory at 1,100 feet (335 metres) for panoramic views over the surrounding area. After admiring the vista, drive back to downtown Hakodate to the Kanemori Red Brick Warehouse district.

Kanemori Red Brick Warehouse Area

This waterfront area was once the site of shipyards and foreign settlements and since about 1879, it prospered as a warehouse zone. The original buildings were destroyed by fire but were rebuilt in 1909. The Kanemori logo on these buildings once symbolized the trade-port of Hakodate. Re-modeled in 1988 as part of a waterfront area redevelopment with a theme of 'the old and the new', these buildings house shops, restaurants, galleries and meeting areas, while still offering a glimpse into Hakodate's golden age of shipping.

Following some free time to explore, re-board your coach for the return drive to the pier.

(Hakodate cable car will not be operated due to the bad weather. In this case, the tour will go up/ down to Mt. Hakodate by bus and may partially vary the tour itinerary)

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 1 mile (1.6 kilometres), with 40 steps at the aerial cable car on Mt. Hakodate and up to 70 steps at the top of the mountain as well as 40 steps at the museum. Onuma National Park

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximate one-hour drive to Onuma National Park, which is renowned for its picturesque, island-dotted lakes and dormant volcano, Mount Komaga-take. At approximately 3,937 feet (about1,200 metres), Mount Komaga-take is a prominent feature of the landscape in this part of southern Hokkaido.

Thanks to a temperate climate and a combination of heavy rainfall and melting snow, the area is a paradise for bird-life and boasts an abundance of diverse vegetation. The park's most attractive area is located between the two lakes, Onuma and Konuma (large and small lakes), which are explored on foot during your 1.5-2-hour guided nature walking tour.

The walking trails meander between the lakes' peninsulas and islands, several of which are connected by small bridges. Your guide serves as a translator for the Japanese-speaking nature guide.

Following your walking tour, re-board your coach for the approximate one-hour drive back to the pier.

Approximately 80 nuns are living at the Convent at any given time. Devoted to hard work and prayer, the nuns start their day at 3.30am and retire at 7.45pm. The women pray 7 times throughout the day. The Trappist convent was established in the 19th century and its formal name is "Our Lady of the Lighthouse Trappist Monastery".

Goryokaku Park and Hakodate Magistrate's Office

The park is home to the remaining walls of Japan's first Western -style fort. The fort is named Goryokaku or 'Pentagon Fort' due to its star shape. Nothing is left of the citadel, which was constructed by the Togukawa Shogunate to defend Japan and the Magistrate's office against the threats from the north. The Magistrate's Office building was completed in 1864.

At Goryokaku Tower, quests will ride the elevator up to the Observation Deck of the 351ft (107m) tower at the park entrance, and take in splendid views of the park, Fort, Mt. Hakodate and the downtown area. Enjoy a stroll through the park to the Hakodate Magistrate's Office, which provides a stunning example of traditional Samurai (Edo) architecture.

The Great Buddha

Depart the pier for the approximate 90-minute drive to Kamakura. Visit the Kotokuin Temple and the giant sitting Buddha cast, that was built in the 13th century. With a height of 43 feet (13 m), it is the second tallest bronze Buddha in Japan, surpassed only by the statue in the Todaiji Temple in Nara. The Buddha was originally located inside a large temple. However, the buildings were destroyed by several typhoons and a tidal wave in the 14th and 15th centuries, so the Buddha now stands in the open air.

Tsurugaoka Hachimangu Shrine

Visit Kamakura's most important shrine whose main pavilion was built by Minamoto Yoritomo in 1185 to celebrate the establishment of the Minamoto Shogunate, the first of the Kamakura government. The shrine is dedicated to Hachiman, the patron god of the Minamoto family and of the samurai in general. An uphill walk with approximately 62 steps is required to reach the main hall of the Tsurugaoka Hachimangu Shrine. The main hall stands on a terrace at the top of a wide stairway.

Spend some free time exploring the shops along Komachi-Dori Street where traditional and modern shops stand side by side. Re-board your coach for the drive back to ship.

Foot Town, a four storey building directly under the tower houses museums,

restaurant and shops. Upon arrival at the Tokyo Tower, take the elevator up to the 500-foot-high (152m high) observation platform for panoramic vistas overlooking the city.

Following your visit, re-board your coach and commence the approximate 30-minute drive back to the pier.

Depart the pier for an approximately 40 minute drive to Tokyo. After a scenic sightseeing comence your self exploration day. **Asakusa Senso-ji Temple**

Founded in the early-7th century, it is the oldest extant temple in Tokyo. Enter through the Kaminarimon Gate, or 'Nitenmon', which is bedecked (weather-permitting) with a huge red paper lantern. It is an ancient Buddhist temple and one of it's most significant. Formerly associated with the Tendai sect of Buddhism, it became independent after World War II. Adjacent to the temple is a five storey pagoda as well as many shops with traditional goods. The temple has a titanium tiled roof that maintains the historic image but is stronger and lighter.

Your tour includes a stroll down the Street of Inside Shops, or 'Nakamise-Dori', an alley lined with traditional vendors selling food, souvenirs and handmade crafts. After an explanation from guide you will have free time at Asakusa to enjoy shopping or enjoying local foods or sweets.

Ginza

Your tour concludes with a visit to the Ginza, one of the most luxurious shopping districts in the world. The streets of the Ginza are lined with numerous internationally renowned department stores, boutiques, restaurants and bars. It is considered to be one of the most expensive, elegant and luxurious streets in the world. This is a great place for window-shopping.

Upon arrival, approximately 3 hours is made available for browsing the shops at your leisure, lunch at your own expense before commencing the brief panoramic drive back to the pier.
